

## OUR SIX TOP TIPS TO AVOID UK IMMIGRATION APPLICATION REFUSAL

- Disclosing Your Previous Immigration History or Material Fact: It is crucial that you discuss all previous refusals, regardless of whether they occurred in the UK or any other country. Failure to disclose previous refusal information to the UK Home Office may result in a refusal of your application due to an allegation of deception. This could lead to a mandatory ban on future UK visa applications for a period of 10 years.
- 2 Submit Corroborating Evidence or Specified Evidence: Specified evidence involves providing precise information related to financial stability, employment, and other relevant details. For example, when submitting bank statements, ensure they include the bank name, branch name, and country name. Always refer to the relevant immigration rules or policy guidance to ensure the correct specified evidence is provided. Corroborating evidence refers to supplying essential information about a family member residing in the UK, including their birth certificate, passport, and pay slips.
- 3 Selecting the Correct Application Form: Selecting the appropriate application form is crucial to avoid complications. Make sure you are aware of your eligibility and apply accordingly. When applying for any UK visa, carefully choose the correct option that suits your circumstances.
- 4 Disclosing a Previous Criminal Conviction: If you have a police caution, you will be ineligible for ILR for a period of 2 years. If the UK Home Office inquires about any criminal convictions, then you must disclose the information. However, if it is not relevant to your case, it will not negatively affect your visa application.
- Submit Financial Evidence to Support Your Stay in the UK: It is essential to provide corroborating evidence and information that explains the source of your funds. If you are receiving financial support from family members or friends, you must provide evidence of the reason for their support and your relationship with them. Ensure that you provide well-supported evidence and explanations. Don't forget to attach bank statements, pay slips, and tax returns along with your visa application.
